

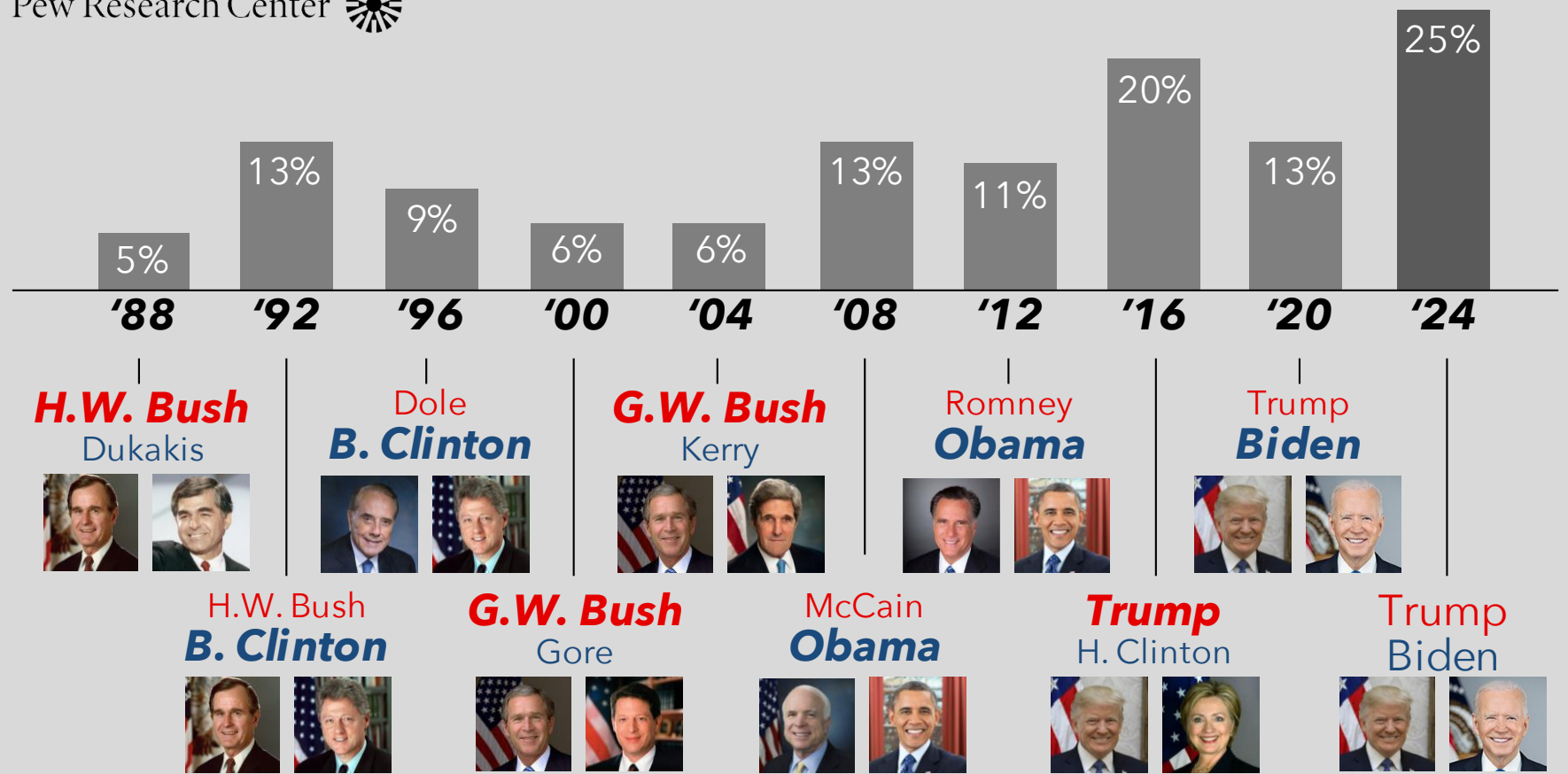
Chart of the Day



According to a recent Pew Research survey, more Americans view both major party candidates *unfavorably* now than in any of the past 10 US elections. In fact, over the last three Presidential election cycles - 2016, 2020, and 2024 - each of the candidates from both parties have had favorability ratings below 50%, which is the first time this has happened over the last 50 years. Biden-Trump is also the first "repeat" Presidential election since 1956.
