Arizona

MUFG supported St. Mary's Food Bank in delivering thousands of meals to hungry Arizonans, and our colleagues helped pack Emergency Food Boxes. In partnership with Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona, we provided a grant which covered half the construction costs for a new home. Colleagues rolled up their sleeves and helped build the new home alongside the future homeowners. MUFG funding also provided 1,800 safe shelter nights and supportive services at UMOM New Day Centers assisting unhoused families in Maricopa County.

California

MUFG has strong ties with the Japanese American community in California, including support for the Japanese American National Museum (JANM). We have backed various initiatives and programs. Our colleagues volunteered to address issues from food insecurity to nature conservation. Following the Los Angeles wildfires, we donated \$500,000 to the American Red Cross to aid victims with food, shelter, emotional care, recovery planning, and financial assistance.

Florida

MUFG collaborated with Feeding Tampa Bay to provide 250,000 meals to individuals experiencing food insecurity, including disaster response. In partnership with Habitat for Humanity of Hillsborough County, we assisted in building and repairing homes for low-income families.

Additionally, we funded conservation initiatives with Keep Tampa Bay Beautiful. We funded adult education and employment programs for people experiencing homelessness with Metropolitan Ministries; supported college completion efforts with the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, and promoted the skills of the local workforce through the Tampa Bay Chamber of Commerce Foundation.

Outside the U.S.

Brazil

Colleagues in Brazil supported Santa Casa de Diadema by participating in activities such as cooking, creating a vertical garden, and providing career advice to teenagers. The company also donated fans to the center to help students during the hot summer months.

Canada

More than 250 colleagues in Canada participated in 20 charitable activities. Together, they also raised \$18,000 Canadian dollars to support Interval House, Canada's first center for survivors of domestic violence. MUFG also made a donation to the Canadian Red Cross Disaster Recovery Fund to support ongoing disaster relief efforts.

Colombia

In Colombia, colleagues organized an arts and crafts workshop at Albergue Luisito, a nonprofit housing facility that supports families of children undergoing cancer treatment.

New York Metro Area

MUFG is proud to support nonprofits across New York and New Jersey through financial contributions, volunteerism, and strategic partnerships that address critical community needs—including affordable housing, food insecurity, economic empowerment, and educational advancement.

In a powerful demonstration of unity, hundreds of employees came together to honor the legacy of September 11 through hands-on service. Additionally, colleagues took part in the Corporate Challenge in Central Park—an opportunity to support charitable causes, foster team spirit, and connect with peers across the financial services industry.

Texas

MUFG helped provide 60,000 nutritious meals to families, children, and seniors through the North Texas Food Bank. Our funding also empowered adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities through My Possibilities. Additionally, we invested in programs aimed at improving the quality of life for children living at or below the poverty level with Kids Matter International.



Mexico

Employees in Mexico volunteered at Institución Alegrias, Casa Hogar, a shelter for 100 girls and young women. They painted the facility, made a mural, and built a garden.
