We're proud of our **philanthropic efforts** in the communities where we live and operate. Here are some key highlights:



Arizona

MUFG supported St. Mary’s Food Bank, Arizona’s largest food bank, in delivering 250,000 meals to community members in need, and our colleagues helped pack Emergency Food Boxes. MUFG funding also provided 1,800 safe shelter nights and supportive services at UMOM New Day Centers to families and individuals experiencing homelessness.

California

MUFG demonstrates its strong support of programs that promote cultural exchange between the US and Japan through organizations such as the Japanese American National Museum (JANM) . Our employees volunteer their time and services to community organizations that support workforce development, address food insecurity, and help end homelessness.

Florida

MUFG collaborated with Feeding Tampa Bay to provide 250,000 meals to individuals experiencing food insecurity, with employees also volunteering on-site to pack food. Through our partnership with Metropolitan Ministries, we funded programs that provide food, housing, and support services for at-risk children and families.

Additionally, we funded conservation initiatives with Keep Tampa Bay Beautiful, while employees removed over 200 lbs of trash from beaches to help protect wildlife.

Outside the U.S.

Brazil

Colleagues in Brazil supported Sta Casa de Diadema by donating school kits to 226 children and adolescents from the local community. They also delivered financial education and mentoring sessions to 160 students from a local public technical school through MUFG’s partnership with Junior Achievement.

Canada

Colleagues in Canada raised over \$14,000 and volunteered their time to support Interval House, the country’s first center for survivors of intimate partner violence and their children. MUFG also made a contribution to the Canadian Red Cross to support ongoing disaster relief efforts.

Colombia

MUFG employees partnered with Fundación FANA, a nonprofit organization dedicated to children’s welfare to pack and deliver hygiene and school kits.

New York Metro Area

MUFG is proud to support our partner nonprofits across New York and New Jersey through financial contributions and volunteerism that address critical community needs – including affordable housing, economic empowerment, education, and food insecurity.

Hundreds of employees came together to honor the significance of September 11 through hands-on service that supported local homeless shelters, food pantries, food banks, and food distribution centers.

Texas

MUFG helped provide 60,000 nutritious meals to families, children, and seniors through the North Texas Food Bank. Our funding also empowered adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities through My Possibilities. Additionally, we invested in programs aimed at improving the quality of life for children living at or below the poverty level with Kids Matter International.



Mexico

Employees in Mexico supported the arts program at Autogestión y Educación Comunitaria A.C. (AUGE) by refurbishing their music instruments’ storage room. They also planted 4,500 lettuces for Chinampas de San Gregorio, providing income opportunities for 15 families (~90 people) through the rehabilitation of land for cultivation.
